When a Crisis Hits, Health Care Providers Reach For Your Donations First

You're a Universal Donor. If you're O-Negative, your blood can be transfused to a patient with any blood type. If you're AB, your plasma can be transfused to any patient in need of plasma, no matter their blood type. In emergency situations, there may not be enough time to determine the patient's type, and that's where your donations come into play. The news media breaks a story, and the community reacts by lining up around the block to give blood. Or a call may go out from a blood center asking donors to come in. We've seen this happen many times, both on a national level and locally. But the blood or plasma on the shelves at the time an emergency takes place is the first to be used.

One Year Ago - Pulse

This month marks the first anniversary of the deadliest terrorist attack on U.S. soil since September 11, 2001. A single gunman entered Pulse nightclub in Orlando, Florida, Sunday, June 12, 2016, killing 49 and injuring 58.

OneBlood in Orlando has an average weekly volume of 18,000 pints (compared to CBCO's 1,150). In the week after the shooting, OneBlood's donors gave 28,000 pints.

While CBCO was not called on to help provide blood to Orlando following the shooting, blood centers within an independent group called America's Blood Centers are ready to provide blood to other centers in extreme situations. For example, CBCO helped out when additional blood was needed following Hurricane Katrina.





Last month was the sixth anniversary of an EF5 tornado cutting a 1-mile path through Joplin, Missouri. In 38 minutes, 158 people were killed (plus three additional deaths related to the storm), and 1,150 were injured.

At the time, CBCO provided blood and blood products to 37 area hospitals, including all Joplin hospitals. That number has since increased to 40.

More than 3,000 people donated blood at CBCO in the week following the tornado. Two days after the storm, area hospitals were back to near-normal usage levels.

Generosity

In both situations, community members came together to help. And in both situations, the blood and plasma that was used first was already available on the shelves, thanks to dedicated donors who give even without a news-breaking event taking place.
